




WELCOME

How time flies, Grimmfest No.9 is upon us, its hard to believe we've been running the festival for so long! This year we've a massive selection of amazing films for you, World, European, UK and Manchester premieres galore.

Hightlights this year include the World premieres of Habit, our very own Manchester set horror based on the cult book of the same name, the utterly unique Borley Rectory with Reese Shearsmith and our old friend Nick Vince. International premiers include Ted Geoghegan's follow up to We Are Still Here (a Grimmfest favourite from a few years back), Mowhawk; a visceral violent western, and Fake Blood something very different and enthralling from the makers of Mon Ami (another Grimmfest favourite a while back). We've a whole host of UK premieres including Trench 11, an awesome WW1 set mind fuck. Poor Agnes, M.F.A., Rabbit and The Bride all enriching our female lead 2017 edition. We've something utterly fun and bizarre with the UK premiere of Dave Made A Maze and we host a plethora of Northern premieres including festival favourites, Game of Death, Killing Ground, Still/Born, 68 Kill and Ruin Me. We have brand new UK movies Double Date and Freehold and as our 2017 poster suggests, Leatherface is back with the excellent origin story from the French horror auteurs Alexandre Bustillo and Julien Maury. Last but not least, we've a pre-release screening of the completely nuts Tag (the first 20 mins of this movie are completely jaw droppingly insane!) and our closing night film, the Northern premiere of the equally bonkers Attack Of The Adult Babies from our friends Dominic Brunt and Joanne Mitchel. Look out for quests throughout the festival, we'll have directors, producers, and the stars of many of our films, on hand to introduce and answer questions throughout the festival (you'll find details within the programme).

Alex is no fan of horror movies, but reluctantly agrees to accompany her boyfriend to Slasher Sleepout, an extreme horror-themed event, combining camping trip, survival game, and spook house. But then the fun turns deadly, and Alex must confront her worst fears and personal demons if she wants to escape with her life and sanity intact...

A mischievously post-modern take on the backwoods slasher which parodies classic genre tropes with deft and devious sleight of hand. Keeping the viewer constantly wrong-footed, by a series of reveals and counter-reveals, in which it gradually becomes apparent that the game is far more complex than first appears, and the gamers are not quite who you think...

Michael divides his time between the job centre and the pub. A chance meeting with Lee, an introduction to her Uncle Ian leads to a job working the door at Cloud 9, a seedy massage parlour. After witnessing the violent death of one of the punters, Michael starts having increasingly blood-drenched dreams. Are they flashbacks or fantasies? Little by little, he finds himself being sucked into a dangerous twilight world that he finds irresistibly attractive. Addictive, even.

Grimmfest supremo's Simeon Halligan and Rachel Richardson-Jones return with their third feature, a visceral cinematic visualisation of Stephen McGeagh's acclaimed cult novel, which captures perfectly the dark heart of our fair city of Manchester. Behind the bright lights and bustling bars, the fancy restaurants and hipster hang-outs, there is something older and darker, something dangerous and predatory, that has you right in its sights.

After Mary loses one of her twins in childbirth, she starts to believe that her other child is in danger from an evil spirit. Is she simply suffering from post-natal depression, or is it something far worse?

From Roman Polanski's ROSEMARY'S BABY to Larry Cohen's IT'S ALIVE!, the arrival of a baby in the home never seems to bode well for the protagonists of horror stories. The makers of STILL/BORN know this all too well.

This feature film debut from director Brandon Christiansen, and producer/writer Colin Minihan (EXTRATERRESTIAL, GRAVE ENCOUNTERS, IT STAINS THE SANDS RED) is genuinely creepy and unsettling, dancing deftly between narrative possibilities, the psychological and the supernatural and keeping the viewer guessing till the very end. Benefiting from a nuanced lead performance from Christie Burke as the emotionally damaged mother and featuring another great role for Michael Ironside.

Agnes is a serial killer. Hiding in plain sight in a small town in rural Canada, she carries out a campaign of kidnapping, torture and murder. No matter how blatant she is, nobody suspects a thing. And then one day, Mike shows up on her doorstep; a private investigator looking for one of her early victims. She invites him in, seduces him, and traps him in the basement. And the stage is set for an increasingly disturbing study in sexual power politics... And a particularly unhealthy form of romance!

The perfect date movie for psychopaths, this is an icy study in dominance and submission, complicity and consent. Boasting a spectacular lead turn from Lora Burke as the eponymous Agnes, a kind of evil Reese Witherspoon, it offers a profoundly unsettling exploration of the fundamental need for human contact, even among the most apparently inhuman of people.





In the final days of WWI a shell-shocked soldier must lead a mission deep beneath the trenches of No Man's Land to stop a German experiment that could turn the tide of the war. But it soon becomes apparent that the Germans have already lost control of the situation, and now neither side is safe...

Recalling the classic men-on-a-mission narratives of Sam Fuller or Robert Aldrich, with their hard-bitten cynicism and clear-eyed analysis of the insane ideologies that lead to wars, this combines sharp character detail and a sour vision of human nature with claustrophobic tension, and sudden bursts of visceral horror, in a tight, smart, brutal little movie, which takes no prisoners.

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



A couples' camping trip turns into a frightening ordeal when they stumble across the scene of a horrific crime.

KILLING GROUND drags us kicking and screaming to the Australian outback, for an encounter with the kind of brutish bush-ranging psychopathic white trash that have been a staple of Ozploitation at least as far back as the 70s. But despite its conscious referencing of such genre classics as WAKE IN FRIGHT, THE LONG WEEKEND and the more recent WOLF CREEK, Writer-Director Damien Power's devastating debut feature has a lean, devious meanness all of its own as he cranks up the tension and sense of dread to almost unbearable levels.



An international research team searching for natural resources beneath the Arctic Ocean picks up a series of strange sonic disturbances on their equipment, emanating from the Far North. Thinking this might be a sign of natural gas, they head for the uncharted waters. As they draw closer, they begin to understand the terrible reality of what they have discovered...

2017 marks the centenary of H.P. Lovecraft's short story, "Dagon", which would lay the literary foundations of his entire Cthulhu Mythos. The Grimmfest Team couldn't really let this go unacknowledged. By way of tribute, we are delighted to offer this stunning re-imagining of that classic story - and of the later "Call of Cthulhu". A warning to explorers of the unknown everywhere: "Ph'nglui mglw'nafh Cthulhu R'lyeh wgah'nagl fhtagn!"

Young and beautiful Kira is afflicted with a strange disease: her skin starts to age rapidly, dry out and crumble away. When she discovers that she can replace her own skin with somebody else's, she has to choose: watch her own body wither and die – or give in to temptation... whatever the price

Co-written with cinema maverick Richard Stanley (HARDWARE, DUST DEVIL), and recalling the earlier, more explicitly visceral films of David Cronenberg, Norbert Keil's icy directorial debut is an increasingly uncomfortable meditation on identity and self image. Starting out as a futuristic mystery thriller, as the amnesiac heroine struggles to recover a period of lost time, then shifting increasingly into the realms of body horror, once the true nature of her condition become apparent, the film offers a disturbing examination of the ways in which a woman's sense of worth is so often tied up in how she is perceived by others; due to age or appearance. Boasting a terrifying supporting turn from the great Barbara Crampton as a skin doctor with a very sinister agenda, and some truly wince-inducing practical SFX, this is a smart, visceral Science Fiction shocker.



He and his cocky friend Alex think they've hit the jackpot when they meet the beautiful siblings Kitty and Lulu, who seem up for anything on a wild party-fuelled night. But little do they know that the femme fatales want to make Jim lose much more than just his virginity.

The battle of the sexes just got a whole lot more brutal, as a duo of hapless blokes out on the pull cross paths with a pair of sinister sibling sirens in search of a sacrificial offering, in this broad, bawdy black comedy. Marking the feature-screenwriting debut of Danny Morgan, who also stars as Jim, and featuring a spectacularly sleazy turn from THIS IS ENGLAND's Michael Socha as Alex, a trio of show-stealing cameos from Dexter Fletcher, Robert Glennister and Rosie Cavalero, and a soundtrack by cult band Goat, this is pretty much the perfect date movie. In their reckless pursuit of the truth they find themselves caught up in the world of violent criminals and their victims.

What kind of responsibility does a filmmaker have, to depict violence accurately, and what kind of repercussions can result from that depiction? Beautifully realised, slipping effortlessly between "reality", "imaginative recreation" and "fiction", with cast and crew playing "themselves", this is a real masterclass in audience manipulation, that leads the viewer step by step towards its quietly horrible punchline.



It was also believed in some quarters that the camera was a means to capture the human soul. Travelling with her fiancé to his ancestral home, to prepare for a traditional wedding ceremony, Nastya is about to discover that such beliefs and practices are still very much alive...

A sumptuously-visualised Gothic shocker that features an old dark house filled with shadows and secrets, a creepy housekeeper dressed all in black and a young bride out of her depth. A Russian REBECCA with a supernatural twist all its own, with touches of CRIMSON PEAK and classic Hitchcock.

Following a mysterious, near-fatal collapse, medical student Maude Ashton is plagued by a series of vivid dreams about her twin sister, who has been missing for several years. She returns to her native Australia, certain she now knows where to find her...

If Jane Campion had written and directed MARTYRS. Starting out as an investigative thriller, it grows increasingly rich and strange, as Maude follows her visions and finds herself drawn towards an eccentric hippie community, with an unnerving number of twins. Factor in a sinister private clinic, where sadistic, Mengele-type experiments are being conducted and the stage is set for some dark and dangerous revelations, anchored by an engaging performance from Adelaide Clemens (SILENT HILL: REVELATION, NO-ONE LIVES, THE GREAT GATSBY).

Dave is a would-be artist with completion issues. One afternoon, he builds a huge cardboard maze in the living room. By the time his girlfriend Annie gets home, Dave is lost inside the maze and somehow unable to escape. Worse, there are pitfalls, booby traps, and creatures in there that he doesn't remember creating. But he still won't let Annie demolish the only thing he has ever finished, even to save him. So she puts together a rescue team, and they follow him in...

Part slacker comedy, part retro-80s fantasy adventure, this plays like a manic mash-up of Michel Gondry, Charlie Kaufman, and JOHN DIES AT THE END. A cult classic in the making.

A trendy Los Angeles couple sets up a blind date for two of their friends, one of whom just happens to be a malevolent Elder God. The situation becomes even more awkward with the arrival of a couple of uninvited extra guests...



Shy art student Noelle is struggling to find a voice of her own. After a fellow student forces himself on her at a party, and she is driven to confront and kill him, she taps into a rich source of creative inspiration. Before long, she has become an unlikely vigilante, out to avenge college girls whose attackers have got away. And to develop her own art in the process...

This is an uncomfortably timely feminist reimagining of rape-revenge movie tropes. Thoughtful and smouldering with a righteous sense of rage, it showcases a startling lead turn from Francesca Eastwood, who combines the brittle vulnerability of her mother Frances Fisher with the no-bullshit grit of daddy Clint, and makes for a mesmerising protagonist. Her quest for vengeance is empowering viewing.




